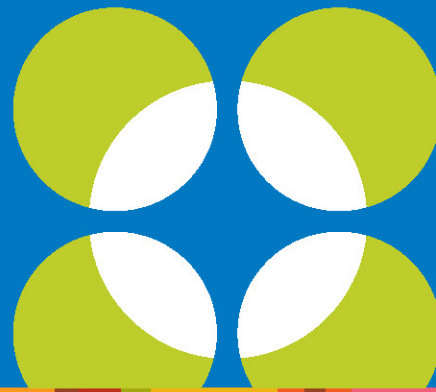


Be involved. Transplant hope.
